

### PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION & TRAININGS:

- o Conducted orientation training on roles responsibilities of cadres and Base line data collection.
- o Legal provision of protection of Land and Water (L&W) workshop was conducted On 24-4-2018. 80 Women Group Leaders were participated in the programme
- o **Interest Groups** were formed in 3 trades: Thatched leaf, Milch animal and Tailoring
- o **Resources Mapping exercise** was conducted on Land & water at N.Kalipatty on 25.07.2018 and at Koodamalai on 14.08.2018. Resource Material were Perpared. Issue based action were initiated in the target villages.



- **Exposure visit:** SSSS organised exposure visit to Jawaathu hills and Chengalpattu. SHG members interacted with the farmer interest groups and farmer Producer Company of Effective Producers Organization. In Chengalpattu Diocese, the team visited the successful IGP activities and women Federation.



- Orientation training was conducted on TNA at Koneripatty 15.10.2018. 45 Interest Group members were participated in the programme. Suitable Trades for marginalized community were identified. Baseline data was collected. 40 marginalized communities are identified through baseline survey.
- Capacity Building Training was conducted for PGs. The following outcome are achieved
  - 3 IGs were started Thatched leaf business.
  - 10 IEs are started Tailoring trade.
  - 16 IEs are started Livestock trade of Milch animal.



- Orientation on evolved strategies and monitoring tools training was conducted and Monitoring tools were developed. Monitoring tool was collected.

- The training on Water Resource Management was conducted. The following impact is measured.

- Identification and sensitization of LAW cadres on legal provision of

protection of LAW resources.

- Protection Committee was formed.
- Land and Water Protection Committee solved Drinking water problem in target villages.
- Improving Livelihoods of the most Vulnerable Communities Capacity building trainings to Potential Producer Groups Trade wise training was organized for selected PGs.
  - Marketing Strategies are developed and adopted by the PGs. Trade wise producer group was strengthening. Through these training Livelihoods of Vulnerable communities are improved.
  - Need Based Training (Tailoring, Milch Animal, Thatched leaf) was conducted to PGs in that training Trade wise Livelihoods Plan was



prepared by PGs and Identified the Support System of Financial Linkage

**Introduction**

SSSS has been working with the women mill workers since 2010. With the help of Manos Unidas, SSSS implemented 2 years programme for the former mill workers to gain livelihood and life skills. In that 106 women are shows hardship in their IGP activities. SSSS planned for 4 days training programme for 106 women on business motivation, IGP accounting and maintenance of accounts and interface meeting with bank and beneficiaries.

**Planned Activities**

SSSS conducted 4 days training programme for 106 women in two batches covering the following topics to enable these women to successful entrepreneurs. The trainings topics are as follows:

- ↳ Training on proper maintenance of group accounts
- ↳ Training on IGP accounting.
- ↳ Conduct exposure visits in the fields of best practices.
- ↳ Training on business motivation
- ↳ Interface meetings between bankers and beneficiaries.

**Training on Proper Maintenance of group accounts and IGP accounts**

This training covers quality book keeping, list of registers to be maintained, error rectification, timely updation in registers, how to maintain IGP accounts, deposits, expenses, savings, how to prepare income and expenditure statement, members individual records, etc.

**Training on Business Motivation**

The topics covered in this training were 1) Balancing life and business 2) Time Management 3) strategies that enable you as successful women 4) vision for the future 5) Public relation 6) Technology.

## Field Visits

Field visits enable the participants from different regions to interact with the successful entrepreneurs and help to learn from the entrepreneurs and allowing them to view practical examples of successful integration of sustainable practices in income generation programmes. The participants are taken for field visits on second and third day to nearby success entrepreneurs in goat farming, dairy farming, retail operations and silk thread jewellery.

## Interface Meeting between Bankers and beneficiaries:

SSSS organised interface meeting with ICICI bank and cooperative bank staff with women participants. The savings mobilized by these Groups are not sufficient to meet the income generation programme activities. Thus, it is necessary for these women to supplement their resources by availing loans from banks. Now the participants were well aware of the necessary documents for loans and the factors that makes delay in getting the loan.

## Outcome of the project:

- The 106 participants got clear knowledge in maintaining the group accounts and IGP accounts.
- The participants are now aware and start maintaining the records as per the bank needs
- The exposure visit motivated them to run the IGP activity and increased their confidence level
- Through interface meeting, they were very clear about the process in getting the bank loan.
- This training helps these 106 women to enter their IGP activities with new enthusiasm.



**Background :**

Due to Heavy Rain fall in Karnataka in August, 1,70,000 cusecs of water discharged into the Cauvery river from the Kabini and Krishnaraja Sagar reservoirs in Karnataka. This sudden water release made the Mettur reservoir to attain its full capacity of 120 feet. The excess dam water were discharged upto 1,00,000 cusecs in Kavery river. People living in the low-lying areas on the banks of the river are moved to safer places along with their cattle and other belongings. The flood had collapsed the properties of the families living on the banks of the Kavery river. More than 100 houses were collapsed from Mettur to Karur river banks. About 700 families have been displaced to temporary shifts in three districts – Salem, Namakkal and Karur. Among them, the worst affected by the flooding of the Cauvery are the largely impoverished daily wage labourers who have built homes on the river's banks.

**Goal**

To revamp the lives of poor families affected by Heavy flood in Kaveri River of Salem Diocese.

**Specific Objectives**

- To provide immediate relief materials – food provisions and kitchen materials to 30 rain and flood affected families
- To renovate the damaged houses of atleast 6 rain and flood affected families
- To establish a tailoring Training Institute to train the underprivileged women in Salem diocese.

**Executed Activities****Relief materials to Flood affected families**

The SSSS team visited the flood affected areas and rain affected areas of Salem Diocese. The team visited Yercuad, Mettur, Pannavadi, Poolampatti,

Koneripatti, Molasi and Jedarpalayam. As immediate measure, SSSS provided food materials and kitchen utensils valuing Rs.1500 to the 30 affected poor families.

### Renovation of Houses of the poor affected families

SSSS identified six poor families at Jedarpalayam whose houses were damaged by the flood water in Kaveri River. Those families are daily labourers and their land was given by the government for the dalit families. SSSS team helped them by providing cement, bricks and hollow bricks to built houses.



### Establishment of Tailoring Training Institute

SSSS established a Tailoring Training Institute in Kosavampatti to empower the underprivileged women through skill training. Six Industrial power tailoring machine were installed in this institute. The prime target group of this programme are unemployed poor women, dalit women, women living in Slums, destitute widows, daily wages of the affected areas. The institute is maintained by Nazareth Convent sisters. These sisters train the participants on garment products.



**Project Title**

An extensive campaign on Tuberculosis Awareness and nutritional support to poor TB patients to improve adherence

**Background :**

TB is one of the top ten leading causes of death worldwide and the leading cause from a single infectious agent, ranking above HIV/AIDS. In 2017 there were a total of 1,600,000 TB related deaths. Also an estimated 234,000 children died of TB in 2017 including children with HIV associated TB. People who have both TB and HIV when they die, are internationally classified as having died from HIV. There is more about deaths from TB including the 234,000 mainly preventable deaths in children. Worldwide India is the country with the highest burden of both TB and MDR TB. As per the Global TB report 2017 the estimated incidence of TB in India was approximately 28,00,000 accounting for about a quarter of the world's TB cases. Salem is one of the districts with the least health and education indicators.

**Objectives**

- To create awareness on major public health issue Tuberculosis and provide nutritional support to poor TB patients in Mecheri Block of Salem district.

**Executed Activities**

- SSSS formed a team of 8 members for organising the awareness meeting & distribution of nutritional supplements
- SSSS staff made visit to villages and plan with local leaders about the awareness programmes to be conducted
- As per the fixtures, the team visited the villages and conducted the awareness meetings. IEC materials were distributed during the meetings.
- Another team made home visit to the poor TB patients and distributed the nutritional supplements.

### Outcome of the Project

- Twenty villages of Mecheri Block were covered through this programme.
- Two meetings were conducted in Migrant population.
- 437 people were sensitized on Tuberculosis.
- 10 symptomatic people were referred to Mecheri PHC for sputum investigation.
- 30 poor TB patients were supported by nutritional supplements and motivated for proper adherence and completion of treatment.



### Specific objectives

- To strengthen the economic capacities of the Dalit women to lead a better quality of life through skill training and economic support.

### Excuted Activities

- 8 women were trained in dairy production.
- 8 cows were purchased and issued to the targeted women
- Linkages made with the Milk Cooperative Society
- The targeted women have convenient time and space to sufficiently engage in the trade activities

## Chevalir Charitable Trust – Community Borewell



SSSS planned to erect Community bore well in Thumbal and Pungavadi parishes to solve the water scarcity problem of the parishioners and to get water round the clock in the church premises. With the help of Chevalier Charitable Trust, Bangalore, borewells were installed in Thumbal and Pungavadi Church premises. In Pungavadi, borewell was erected upto 600 ft and water with good density drawn from the borewell. In Thumbal, borewell erected upto 1000 ft and failed to get water.

## Caritas India - European Return Reintegration Network programme (ERRIN)

ERRIN programme, started in 2018. Caritas has assisted and reintegrated many European returnees and helped to build up



their life again with the support of 18 local partners. SSSS was one of the partner in Tamil Nadu. Two days ERRIN II workshop has been organized at Caritas India Head Office, New Delhi from 8th April to 9th April 2019 with ERRIN project coordinators. SSSS had recieved two European returnees for reintegration programme from Namakkal district. A team from SSSS visited both returnee and working on reintegration plan.

## Loyola Foundation – Vehicle Project

On 12th April 2019, Salem Social Service Society has purchased A New Vehicle “Scorpio” with the Financial assistance of Loyola Foundation, U.S.A for facilitating development programmes in Salem Diocese.

## Our activities in 2018-2019

- **Holy Mass:** The holy Eucharist is celebrated every month regularly.
- **Prison Police training:** - Seminar on "first Aid" for the trainees of prison department was held in Salem central prison. Around 150 police throughout Tamil Nadu participated. Sr. Dr. Anne Joyce, MS. DGO from St. Mary's hospital handled the session.
- Celebrations we had in prisons are Women's Day, Wedding celebration, Independence Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Deepavali day and Christmas celebrations.
- Legal Help given to 9 members.
- Education assistance given to 10 inmates in Salem central prison who wrote 10th and 12th examinations. All the 10 inmates were passed.
- Educational assistance Rs. 59,000 given to 6 children of the prison inmates.
- Given 7 bicycles to prison inmate's children.
- **RELEASED and Rehabilitated:**
  - On the 8th of Sept. the 53 life prisoners were released from Salem central prison. Among them, prisoner Kathamuthu from Tuticorin spent 22 years in prison and his family was not ready to accept him. After prison ministry intervention, his son came here and took his father home. The Legion of Mary members from shevapet parish gave him Rs. 6000 for his family. Now Kathamuthu is working as a watchman in one of our institute.
  - Mr. Prakasam who was in the prison for 14 years has been released last week. He is helped financially to run a small watch shop in the new bustand.
  - Seven members were given Tailoring machines
  - 5 members were employed in Gas company, security office etc.
- **NATIONAL CONFERENCE:** The 12<sup>th</sup> National conference of Prison Ministry of India was held in Guwahati in October, 2018. Sr. Joyce won the national award for "Prisoner's life story writing Competition"
- **CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS:** On 15<sup>th</sup> December 2018, Christmas celebrations took place in Attur, Namakkal, Paramathi vellor, Omalour, Rasipuram and in Tiruchegodu sub jails.

- On 22<sup>nd</sup> December Christmas was celebrated in Salem central prison. Bishop Rt.Rev.Dr.Singaroyan presided over the function. Prison Ministry Secretary, Rev.Fr. M. Rajamanicam, Rev. Fathers from Pattlur, religious sisters and lay volunteers were present. Schools children performed beautiful dances for the inmates. At the end of the programme, Bishop cut the Christmas cake and gave his blessings. Chicken briyani was provided to all the thousand plus inmates and staff.
- **PMI -Tamil Nadu Executive Meet:** PMI Executive meeting was held at Chennai on Jan 2019, Sr. Joyce has been elected as a zonal coordinator for the zone which includes Dharmapuri, Ooty, Coimbatore and Salem dioceses.
- **Dental camp :** PMI Salem Unit organized the Dental camp on Ash Wednesday in Central prison Salem from 10a.m to 2pm. 150 inmates benefitted through this camp.
- On 15th of June 2018 Prison ministry unit organized a welfare programme for the prisoners family members at Anbu ILLam. 75 members from 25 families were specially invited for the days programme. The Bishop of Salem Rt.Rev. Singarayon presided over the function. Rev. Fr. John Joseph, Infant Jesus Cathedral presented a kit grossary which was sharing from Vincent de Paul Society. PMI provided a kit worth Rs.3000 containing new Saries, dress materials, Rice, note books and school bags. Beside this each participants was given Rs. 1000 for travelling expenses. At the end all were served delicious meal.
- **Volunteers Meet :** The volunteers gathering was held with the presiding of Bishop. Bishop distributed the ID - Cards to the regular volunteers.
